



2nd Quarter Parent Letter

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the 2nd Quarter! Here's an outline of what we plan on teaching the 2nd quarter:

Social Studies:

We will navigate through Illinois Social Studies United States Region My World Interactive 3. This quarter we will be focusing on:

Chapter 2: Economics

In this chapter we will discuss goods and services, types of resources, economic choices, and human capital and our future.

Chapter 3: Communities Build a Nation

In this chapter the students will learn about America's first peoples, early explorers, early Spanish and French communities, and creating a new nation.

Science:

This quarter we will continue to work in our science series **Inspire Science**. This quarter, we will continue working on Unit 2. The students will learn about plant and animal life cycles and traits. The class will research animal group survival as well.

Reading/Writing:

This quarter's reading and writing program will consist of several components. We will continue to utilize the ARC/IRLA program. The IRLA is a unified standard-based framework for student assessment, text leveling, curriculum, and instruction. The IRLA ensures that grade level instruction in reading is rigorous and that differentiated support meets the needs of all students in our class. Through extensive reading, writing, research, and critical analysis, students develop knowledge and expertise in a variety of disciplines, preparing them to lead in a changing world. Novels will be used as a supplement to this program. This quarter, we will read ***Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*** by Roald Dahl.

For in-depth spelling, phonics, and grammar skills, we will use "**Zaner-Bloser Spelling Connections**". This program prepares students with systemic lessons and effective practices that will improve their ability to communicate both verbally and in writing. In addition, students will complete daily language reviews as a group. The class will also be asked to write journal entries 2-3 times per week. We will begin with unit 9. We typically complete one unit/week. A test will be given at the end of each unit.

Math:

- Topic 4 Use Multiplication to Divide: Division Facts
- Topic 5 Fluently Multiply and Divide within 100
- Topic 6 Connect Area to Multiplication and Addition

We would like you to work on addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts with your child for about 15 minutes/night 4-5 days a week.

Classroom Behaviors:

Students will be given 3 verbal warnings throughout the day, if necessary. If the behavior continues then a call or email to the parents will be made/sent to discuss the student's behaviors. If your child exhibits behaviors not consistent with our classroom rules on a regular basis, a meeting will be set to discuss strategies to get your child back on track.

Communication:

Grading:

Assessments: 50% of grade

Classroom assignments: 40% of students grade

Homework and Participation: 10% of grade
